Auld, Kathleen Gwynneth

Thesis Title: Sustainable development of small-scale fisheries and the need for strong measures to protect small-scale fisheries in international trade law

Kathleen Auld holds BCom, LLB, and LLM degrees from UCT, and began full-time study towards her PhD in 2018. She undertook legal articles in Cape Town, and was admitted as an Attorney, Notary, and Conveyancer of the High Court of South Africa in 2015. Kathleen Auld's thesis focuses on problems facing smallscale fisheries, and considers how the development challenges of this group can best be provided for in international trade agreements dealing with fisheries subsidies. She created a framework of development needs of small-scale fisheries. This allows her to compare optimum development outcomes with what is currently being provided for small-scale fisheries in trade agreements. In considering current trade agreements she finds a number of shortcomings in the creation of good sustainable development outcomes for small-scale fisheries, as well as limitations on what can be included in these agreements. Her recommendations for these agreements going forward include, amongst others, the improvement of equity between different fishing sectors, participation of small-scale fisheries in issues that affect them, and the exemption of social development projects from subsidy bans, subject to conditions to protect the sustainability of aquatic ecosystems.

Supervisor: Professor Loretta Feris (Public Law) Cogger, Jonathan Robert Thesis Title: Inheritance and redistribution: exploring the constitutional commitment towards redistribution in the private law of succession

Jonathan Cogger holds BA and LLB degrees from the University of the Witwatersrand. He began full-time study towards his PhD at the School of Law at UCT in 2015, and is currently practising as a human rights attorney in Cape Town. Jonathan Cogger's thesis explores the extent to which the common law principle of freedom of testation is a constitutionally protected property right in light of constitutional commitments to redistribution, restitution and historical redress. His analysis involves an interpretation of the nature, purpose and scope of section 25 of the Constitution (the property clause) in the context of testate succession law. He critiques the accepted academic and judicial view that individual property ownership is central to the constitutional protection of freedom of testation. He argues that this interpretation of the property clause ignores accepted constitutional property jurisprudence of the interpretive approach to the property clause, which has emphasised that property protection should be subject to the overarching authority of the State to transform the legacy of past racial discrimination in access to land and property. His research shows that while freedom of testation should be constitutionally protected, this should never be at the expense of constitutional goals of promoting more equitable access to land.

Lehmann, Karin Helga Thesis title: *The distribution of retirement fund death benefits: an analysis of the equitability and constitutionality of Section 37C of the Pension Funds Act 24 of 1956*

Karin Lehmann completed her BA LLB degrees at UCT and obtained her LLM from the University of Nottingham. She is a lecturer in UCT's Department of Commercial Law.

Karin Lehmann's thesis comprises a critical examination of section 37C of the Pension Funds Act. That section governs the payment of socalled 'death benefits' which are lump sums that consist of the accumulated savings of retirement fund members, as well as the proceeds of any group life insurance that becomes payable on the death of a retirement fund member. The section provides that lump sums do not form part of the assets of retirement fund members' estates. As a result, the member does not have the right to select the beneficiaries of the lump sum. Instead, the right to do so is conferred on the trustees of the respective retirement fund. By analysing cases that have come before the Pension Funds Adjudicator. Karin Lehmann's thesis examines how section 37C of the Pensions Fund Act is applied in practice. Her findings lead to a conclusion that section 37C is unconstitutional in its design and inequitable in its operation, and thus in urgent need of legislative reform.

Marumoagae, Motseotsile Clement Thesis Title: *Adjudication of child relocation disputes in South Africa*

Motseotsile Marumoagae holds LLB and LLM degrees from the University of the Witwatersrand, in addition to an LLM degree from North West University.

Motseotsile Marumoagae's thesis focuses on the manner in which judges adjudicate child relocation disputes where one parent wishes to leave South Africa with children and the other parent opposes the proposed relocation. Through examination of decided cases, he demonstrates that judges use very wide discretion when deciding cases of this kind. Some judges may emphasise particular factors to

allow or deny permission to relocate, while other judges may render the same factors insignificant in order to reach alternative outcomes. This renders the law relating to child relocation disputes inconsistent and unpredictable. He argues for the limitation of judicial discretion in child relocation disputes through the provision of legislative guidelines which will assist judges when determining these matters. he has crafted specific legislative guidelines which he argues should be used to limit judicial discretion in child relocation disputes. Furthermore, Motseotsile Marumoagae proposes amendment of the Children's Act 38 of 2005, to incorporate his proposed legislative guidelines. He is of the view that establishment of a legislative mechanism will enable judges to identify, select, weigh and adequately balance competing factors in child relocation disputes to ensure that all cases are thoroughly investigated and considered.

Monye, Ogochukwu Fidelia Thesis Title: *Rethinking the legal and institutional framework for digital financial inclusion in Nigeria*

Ogochukwu Monye completed her Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of Nigeria and obtained her Master of Laws degree at Queen Mary University, London. She is a lecturer in the Business Law Department, University of Benin, Nigeria. Ogochukwu Monye's thesis considers the suitability of Nigeria's legal and regulatory framework for financial inclusion as a basis for addressing the needs of the financially excluded in that country. Her thesis investigates the reasons for the country's high financial exclusion figures, in spite of an abundance of regulatory initiatives. Using a combination of doctrinal and empirical methods, she highlights the burden experienced by Nigeria's financially excluded in attempting to access financial services. She goes on to discuss the country's strategies for financial inclusion and to explore various options for regulatory policy adjustments. The goal of Ogochukwu Monye's thesis is to inform processes of instituting regulatory changes that can drive a methodical migration of ever

more of Nigeria's excluded class into the formal financial sector.

Mudimu, Godknows

Thesis title: The effectiveness of codes of conduct of selected South African mining companies in regulating labour standards: window dressing or genuine regulatory instruments?

Godknows Mudimu holds a BSocSc and LLB from Rhodes University and an LLM degree from UCT. He has clerked for the Chief Justice of Namibia and has worked for the African Mining Legislation Atlas and as a researcher in various units and institutes at UCT.

Godknows Mudimu's thesis assesses the effectiveness of codes of conduct used by mining companies as complementary regulatory instruments on labour standards. It investigates the failure of state regulatory instruments to protect all workers at mines (particularly those who are not direct employees of the mining houses themselves) by focusing on the enabling rights of freedom of association and collective bargaining and on the right to a safe working environment. Through assessing codes of conduct, tracing their development and usage by mining companies, Godknows Mudima places such instruments on a regulatory spectrum with varying degrees of state influence in their development. His thesis offers recommendations for redesigning codes of conduct to increase their legitimacy and effectiveness and to enable those codes to become democratic instruments in the regulation of labour standards.

Sithole, Linet

Thesis Title: Women's right to access family planning and maternal health care services in Hwange Rural District, Zimbabwe: challenges and opportunities

Linet Sithole holds an LLB degree and an MA in Human Rights Law from the University of Fort Hare. She joined the Faculty of Law at UCT in 2016 for her PhD studies. She is a lecturer in the Department of Private Law at Midlands State University, Zimbabwe.

Linet Sithole's thesis focuses on rural women's right to access family-planning and maternal health care services in rural Zimbabwe. She investigates factors that impede women from accessing such services - and potential opportunities to alleviate the limitations. She uses data gathered from interviews with women living in Hwange Rural District. Her findings show that lack of knowledge of reproductive health care rights, restrictive laws, physical barriers like distance to the nearest health facility, availability of services, poverty, religion and patriarchal tradition, are factors limiting women from accessing reproductive health care services. The findings suggest how laws and policies can respond directly to the unique challenges faced by rural women. Constitutional and human rights litigation may be possible. However, extrajudicial avenues including grassroots mobilisation and involvement of nongovernmental organisations, emerge as the most promising opportunities to ensure that rural women have access to these services.

Smith, Stephen Eugene

Thesis Title: The characterisation for South African taxation purposes of gains and losses arising from the use of equity financial derivative instruments

Stephen Smith completed his BCom, BCom(Hons) and Advanced Taxation Certificate at UNISA. He consults on financial sector policy development, has served on Higher Education public entity boards and is a commercial

member of the Tax Court of SA. Stephen Smith's thesis the characterisation, considers for purposes of taxation, of gains and losses through financial derivative instruments. He does that since they are subject to general principles of tax law rather than specific provisions of SA tax legislation, and since South African case law offers limited guidance. He undertakes a detailed and extensive analysis of their treatment in the US, UK, Australia and SA. He then applies leading authorities received and interpreted to show that the tax consequences arising from the rights embodied in financial derivative instruments are the same as for any other kind of asset. He develops a legal definition of financial derivative instruments and proffers a recommendation towards a SA tax policy framework. Together these provide an insightful point of departure for SA courts and shed considerable light on a subject that is often seen as profoundly obscure in its complexity.

Stevens, Angela Gail

Thesis Title: *Enforceable accountability: a corporate governance mirage for South African state-owned companies*

Angela Stevens completed her master's degree at UCT in 2016 and began parttime study towards her PhD in 2017. Stevens' Angela thesis focuses on the lack of accountability exhibited by State-Owned Companies ('SOCs') which has contributed to their deteriorating performance. SAA SOC Limited is utilised as the case study and a direct examination of their annual integrated reports illustrates a dire lack of accountability. This lack of accountability is evident despite the apparent implementation of the current statutory rules and the application of the recommended practices for good corporate governance. The negative impact which the state has, as the sole shareholder of SOCs, is also investigated as a major contributor to the accountability issue. A proposed framework, comprising

the implementation of new statutory measures and a reformed approach to corporate governance, is suggested to resolve the lack of accountability of SOCs. This framework also involves the application of an incentive-based mechanism to implement the concept of enforceable accountability for all SOCs in South Africa.

Thabane, Tebello Napthtali

Thesis Title: *The ownership and control architecture of South Africa's stateowned companies and its impact on corporate governance*

Tebello Thabane holds BA (Law) and LLB degrees from the National University of Lesotho. He also holds an LLM from the University of Pretoria and an LLM from the University of the Free State. He is a senior lecturer in Commercial Law at UCT. Tebello Thabane's thesis whether enquires poor corporate governance in state-owned companies (SOCs) can be attributed to the model of ownership and control. He first challenges the conceptualisation of SOCs as profit companies and argues that they should instead be conceptualised as public interest companies. He claims that the ownership model lacks a clear and consistent economic and political logic. He also argues that the state's ownership leads concentration to excessive shareholder control powers, which in turn engender political interference and erode the autonomy and authority of boards to govern effectively. He further argues that the legal and regulatory regime governing SOCs is complex and fragmented. He proposes a nuanced, minimalist and structured architecture underpinned by the public interest and characterised by the following: mixed ownership, in appropriate circumstances; a simplified legal and regulatory regime; professional boards; and a state holding company that will hold all state shares and shield the various SOCs from political interference.

Tsietsi, Tsotang

Thesis Title: Trade facilitation in the Southern African development community: the potential contribution of the World Trade Organization's trade facilitation agreement

Tsotang Tsietsi holds a Bachelor of Laws degree from the National University of Lesotho and a Master of Law degree from the University of Cambridge. She has enjoyed a career as an academic teaching international economic law.

Tsotang Tsietsi's thesis investigates the barriers to facilitated trade in the Southern African Development Community (SADC). These are barriers to the physical movement of goods across borders (imports and exports). She considers the shortcomings of the regional and international agreements that have regulated trade facilitation in the region. She finds these to be, in the main: normative deficiencies, a lack of flexibility to takes into account each country's unique circumstances, inadequate technical assistance, weak institutional arrangements, and poor coordination and implementation strategies. Tsotang Tsietsi proposes that the World Trade Organization's Trade Facilitation Agreement has unique advantages that may render it an important contribution to the alleviation of the trade barriers. She thus argues that it may assist in improving SADC states' trade and development outcomes.
